



Queensland – Easing of Restrictions

With effect from 6am on 15 April 2021, the requirement to wear face masks across Queensland when inside have been removed. The requirements to wear a face mask in airports, aeroplanes and quarantine related activities continue to be in place.

People are still encouraged to carry a face mask at all times and to wear it in situations where they cannot achieve physical distancing of 1.5m.

INTRODUCTION

This Advice was developed to keep Members informed of the restrictions imposed due to recent cases of COVID-19 in Queensland. With restrictions and requirements now returned to their pre-lockdown status, this will be the last version of this Advice.

UPDATE 15 APRIL 2021

The additional requirements for the wearing of masks that commenced on 29 March 2021, ceased at 6am on 15 April 2021. People in Queensland are still encouraged to carry a face mask and to wear it in situations where physical distancing of 1.5m cannot be achieved.
